**PROGRAM** The MCAC Program Committee provides professional development and education of professionals dealing with children and families affected by child abuse and neglect. The committee sponsors 6 educational programs every year, including the August Conference and January Kick-off Breakfast.


**PREVENTION** The Prevention Committee plans and implements activities that raise community awareness about the problem of child abuse. These activities support the strategic plans of Prevent Child Abuse Nebraska and MCAC.

SEXUAL ABUSE The Sexual Abuse Committee responds to the need of therapists and other professionals working with victims of child sexual abuse by providing awareness, education, advocacy, and coordination of sexual abuse issues.

THERAPY The Therapy Committee gathers and disseminates a therapist list of MCAC members.

TRUANCY The Truancy Committee continues to work toward finding solutions to truancy and to advocate for a best practices approach in the community. The committee has the following four subcommittees that focus on different aspects of this complex issue: 1) Primary Prevention, 2) Secondary Prevention, 3) Pre-Court Intervention, and 4) Justice Intervention.

**WEB SITE** The Web site Committee provides regular updates to the Web site and continually finds ways to educate the community by providing resources and useful links.
