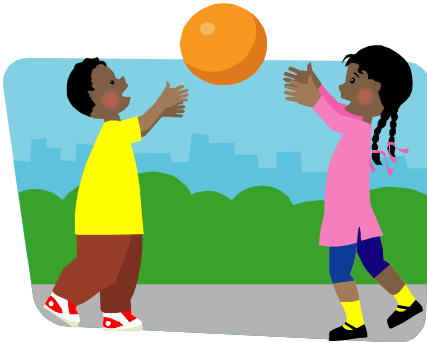
Metropolitan Child Advocacy Coalition (MCAC)

Area professionals from a variety of disciplines including the medical community, law enforcement, the therapeutic community, child protective services, social services, county attorney offices, the court system, probation, the educational community, and other interested professionals are involved with MCAC.



MCAC COMMITTEES

MEMBERSHIP The Membership Committee maintains an accurate and updated data base of MCAC active/paid members.

NEWSLETTER The Newsletter Committee publishes *M.C.A.C. News*, an 8 page newsletter, six times per calendar year as a benefit to MCAC members. Included inside these issues are: information about MCAC, our Board and Membership, along with resources and articles on issues related to child abuse and neglect today.

PROGRAM The MCAC Program Committee provides professional development and education of professionals dealing with children and families affected by child abuse and neglect. The committee sponsors 6 educational programs every year, including the August Conference and January Kick-off Breakfast.

An agency membership allows anyone in the agency to take advantage of member benefits.

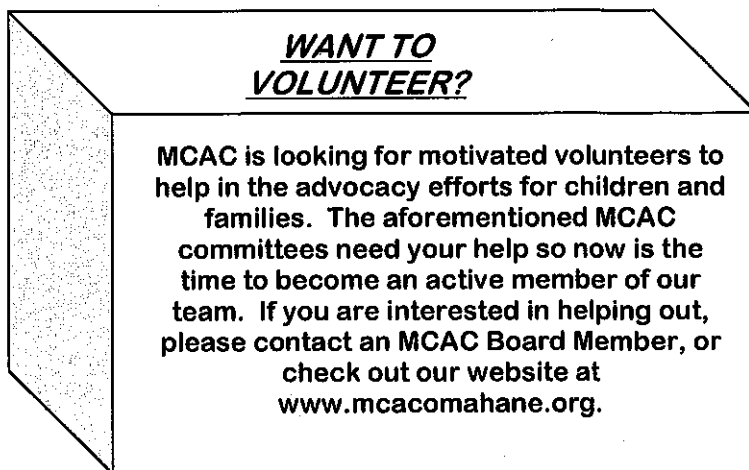
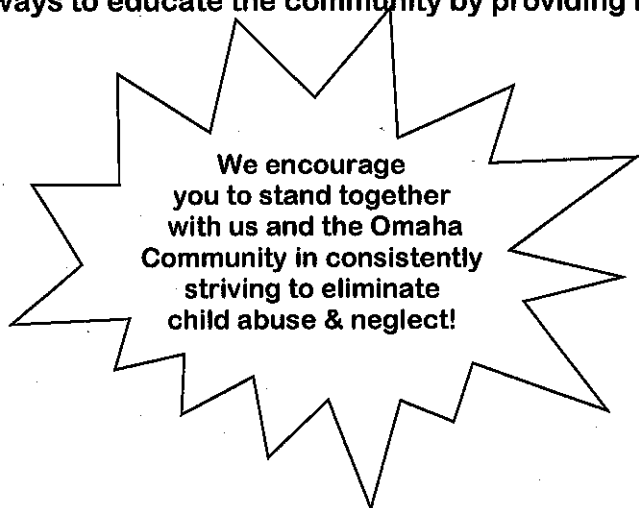
PREVENTION The Prevention Committee plans and implements activities that raise community awareness about the problem of child abuse. These activities support the strategic plans of Prevent Child Abuse Nebraska and MCAC.

SEXUAL ABUSE The Sexual Abuse Committee responds to the need of therapists and other professionals working with victims of child sexual abuse by providing awareness, education, advocacy, and coordination of sexual abuse issues.

THERAPY The Therapy Committee gathers and disseminates a therapist list of MCAC members.

TRUANCY The Truancy Committee continues to work toward finding solutions to truancy and to advocate for a best practices approach in the community. The committee has the following four subcommittees that focus on different aspects of this complex issue: 1) Primary Prevention, 2) Secondary Prevention, 3) Pre-Court Intervention, and 4) Justice Intervention.
